Introduction

The University

The University of Oxford is a complex and stimulating organisation, which enjoys an international reputation as a world-class centre of excellence in research and teaching. It employs over 10,000 staff and has a student population of over 21,000.

Most staff are directly appointed and managed by one of the University's 130 departments or other units within a highly devolved operational structure - this includes 5,900 'academic-related' staff (postgraduate research, computing, senior library, and administrative staff) and 2,820 'support' staff (including clerical, library, technical, and manual staff). There are also over 1,600 academic staff (professors, readers, lecturers), whose appointments are in the main overseen by a combination of broader divisional and local faculty board/departmental structures. Academics are generally all also employed by one of the 38 constituent colleges of the University as well as by the central University itself.

Our annual income in 2010/11 was £919.6m. Oxford is one of Europe's most innovative and entrepreneurial universities: income from external research contracts exceeds £376m p.a., and more than 70 spin-off companies have been created.

Department of Pharmacology

The Department of Pharmacology is based in the University's science area in the centre of Oxford. The Department houses around 180 researchers, postgraduate students and support staff, and has excellent facilities. The members of the Department, associated staff and visiting scientists are all engaged in the investigation of basic questions concerning the interaction of chemical substances with biological systems.

Research in the Department is focused on cell signalling, cardiovascular pharmacology, ion channel and molecular pharmacology and neuropharmacology. In many of these areas the Department plays a leading role in the international pharmacological community. The research of the Department has consistently been given a very high ranking in the Government's assessments of research in Universities and was rated first in the UK for Pre-Clinical Sciences in the 2008 Research Assessment Exercise.

Overview of the role

The postholder will be a recognised international expert who provides intellectual leadership in the area of medicinal chemistry. It is expected that he/she will already be of professorial status. He/she will have established the strategic direction of a major research programme in this area. In addition, the postholder is expected to contribute on an international level to the field of medicinal chemistry and drug discovery to fill an important gap across the Medical Sciences Division. He/she will also be required to play a leading role in the development of industrial links between the Department and Pharma. It is also desirable that the candidate will have experience in developing spin-out companies in the area of drug discovery. The postholder will be responsible for providing vision and direction for research collaborators and colleagues and will be expected to contribute to the Department's teaching efforts.

Responsibilities/duties

- Provide high-level academic research leadership in their specialist field;
- Develop the research strategy and establish university-wide and external collaborations to promote interdisciplinary research;
- Contribute to the intellectual leadership of the department's academic community as a whole, providing direction and mentoring for less experienced research colleagues;
- Broaden the depth and range of research to raise the department's research profile;
- Lead a programme of research at national and/or international level;
- Lead the development of pioneering approaches/methodologies in response to stakeholder expectations and/or research challenges, and open up new avenues of research to extend intellectual understanding;
- Regularly disseminate research findings through presentations at high-profile conferences, publications, and articles in prestigious journals;
- Write funding applications and generate significant research income;
- Conduct complex discussions and negotiations to influence scholars, sponsors, and stakeholders including: national agencies, business and industry leaders, and government policy-makers;
- Chair committees and/or working groups, and contribute to departmental and divisional planning and strategic development;
- Contribute to teaching programmes (especially the Chemical Pharmacology course) and the development of the curriculum in their specialist area, and to examining and academic administration;
- Provide academic supervision for research students;
- Initiate and provide synergy with on-going strategic award activities within the Department and Division
- Help coordinate medicinal chemistry and drug discovery as a major discipline within the Department, across The South Parks Road Campus and in the University more widely.
- Spearhead industrial links and activity within the Department of Pharmacology.

- Depth of knowledge of their specialism to enable the development of innovation and new understanding in the field;
- Ability to operate with credibility across a number of academic disciplines;
- Significant experience of developing research strategies and managing research projects;
- Outstanding publication record as first author in prestigious international journals;
- Successful track record of attracting and managing significant research income;

- Excellent reputation in teaching and academic supervision.
